Hooray for Winter League!

Tournament season is over for the year, and what a year it was! The U.S. had a strong showing at the U.S. Open, the Nationals crowned new champions in Florida, and Divisions witnessed the emergence of some great new talent. But sadly, many of us are now begrudgingly left to count down the days until the first tournaments in February and March. However, for competitive bowlers in the Southwest Division, Winter League is in full swing; allowing diehards a venue to assuage their addiction to the game and competition while granting others the opportunity to further develop their skills for the upcoming tournament season.

In brief, Winter League is a two-month period of competitive inter-club lawn bowling. All clubs in the Southwest Division are encouraged to create one or more four-person teams to compete against other clubs across the division. The division is then divided into two regions of play; North (clubs north of Orange County) and South (clubs south of L.A. County). In addition, Winter League is divided into two tiers of competition: Gold (experienced tournament bowlers) and Silver (new or developing bowlers).

Beginning in December, club teams commence competition with other teams within their region and tier, playing nearly every Saturday for about six weeks. Each match consists of two pairs' games in the morning and a singles and triples game in the afternoon. Each match is worth a total of 40 points consisting of four 15-end games worth 10 points apiece; 2 points each for the winner of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd set of five ends in a game, and an additional 4 points to the team wit the most plus points (not including set points).

At the end of six weeks, the top four teams with the most points in each region enter into a two-week single elimination playoff. The winners of each regions than play one final match against each other to determine the Winter League Champion. The winning club has it's name engraved on a trophy and retains the prize at its clubhouse until a new champion is crowned. It is all great fun, and it infuses friendly club rivalry while keeping things lively during the off-season winter months.
